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Why is it that at school, if we search the same thing we get different results? Students should have the choice of what information gets filtered out . Does Barnards have search results filtered like Macomb Community College does? Universities are increasingly using personal data to predict performance. Do community colleges do the same? Can this be seen as a violation of privacy? For example, when researching about “Revenge Porn” you get blocked off most sites. How is one supposed to find information if all sources are blocked. Should these blocked sites depend on what class you’re taking. Gate keeper resists certain information from the internet blogger. Those who do not have access to the internet at home, rely on the schools internet. Therefore, how can one get work done if internet at school is blocked. This is a good form of privacy, but we should have the choice to what websites should be blocked. Guided pathways to success sets a plan out for what classes to take and gives a set time that everything needs to be completed by. This could kind of be seen as an easy way out, however statistics show that this program has helped many students, specifically minorities. Does this program help or hurt students in the long run? Couldn’t having this set plan put students in a mindset where they think everything is being done for them? When these students are done with the GPS program they may be lost and confused because they are used to having a plan set out for them to follow. This may be good for some students but not for others.
